


WE ARE ASKING FOR SOME FULL ROAD CLOSURES

- Full Road Closures on the Busiest parts of the route
- · Cars and runners are a dangerous mix
- · Pylons can only do so much
- 2500 runners make it too congested the participant experience becomes negative

- Road closures will be from 8am to 12pm
- The full road closures will be in the downtown core and Brunel Road between Main St and Town Line Road.
- Partial-lane road closures will be on Brunel Road and North Mary Lake Road.

The possibility of an accident seems more likely if the roads are open to traffic – even partially. Just the idea of an accident due to traffic makes me uneasy.

I'm looking forward to taking 120 high-school students, again this year, to this fun, safe and welcoming event. I'm truly proud to be a member of a hospitable Huntsville community that allows events like this one to run safely.

To Whom It May Concern;

I have never thought of myself as a runner. I've always claimed that if someone was chasing me, I will walk faster, but I won't run. That's how much I thought I would never run and had no desire to run.

I ran my first 5k in the history of my life. Yes, I RAN! I convinced myself before the race, that I could walk it, I didn't have to run, I just had to finish the race. Well let me tell you, BOTR for me was an exciting event, not only did I want to run, I did run! For most of the race I ran, the excitement of the people cheering you on, the bands throughout the race, the people running encouraging you to keep going, people shouting at you, "you can do it", it was life-changing. Tears came to my eyes throughout that race, because I was doing it! I was running! Not for anyone else, but for myself, to prove to myself I can do it. If it was not for Band on the Run, if it was not for the fun and innovative way to organize and execute a race, I would not be running today. Here's the thing that blows me away, at the end of the race, so many people, friends, strangers, kids, came up to me and congratulated me....what an amazing community we live in where people of all ages are encouraging others to keep it up!

I love that our town supports events like this, it only encourages others to live a healthy and active lifestyle. This is an event that not only brings out the athletes from all over, but brings out the athlete that's inside all of us, I just didn't know I was capable until I joined Band on the Run. Now I'm running three times a week (mic dropped)! All because of this one event and so I want to thank the organizers and volunteers and the town for supporting BOTR.
