

# CURRENT STAGING AND TIMELINE

### King William – 6 Construction Stages



# **Stage Descriptions**

#### **Stage 1 – Bridge to Chaffey**

Install and commission sewers and base course of asphalt on south side of KW

#### Stage 2 – Chaffey to Cann


Complete sewers, base asphalt and curb and gutter. Use of Cann St as detour for westbound traffic

#### Stage 3 – Bridge to Cann

Service Laterals, catch basins and surface works on north side of KW. Complete base asphalt

#### Stage 4 – Cann to Scott

Install and commission sewers, base asphalt and C&G on south side of KW.




#### Stage 5 – Cann to Scott


Base asphalt and C&G on north side of KW. Sewers complete. KW is open on base asphalt.

#### Stage 6 - Bridge to Scott

Paving of final surface course and line painting. Lane reductions only

# **Options to Accelerate**

#### 1. Provide Contractor Additional Flexibility in Stages 1-5

Would allow a more site-wide approach to construction and provide efficiencies (i.e. continue with sewer install into stage 2 prior to without stage 1 asphalt completion requirements).

#### 2. Increased Lane Restrictions

Stage 1 is deepest part of excavation. Allowing Contractor use of 2 lanes for construction instead of 1 through this section increases operating space, staging and speed of construction. Traffic controlled through single lane passage through here (weekends would be two lanes)

#### 3. Extension of Hours

Currently designated as 7am to 7pm (weekdays only). Extension of hours to 7am-9pm (and possible inclusion of weekends) would assist in accelerated completion.



### **Discussions to Date**

Mandatory pre-bid meetings were held in April 2019 with potential contractors to discuss:

- 1. Scope of work;
- 2. Perceived challenges (narrow work areas, maintaining property access, utilities);
- 3. Schedule and staging;
- 4. Contractor Communication with Community; and
- 5. Questions and Clarifications.



### What Was Considered?

- 1. Full road closures;
- 2. 24/7 Construction;
- 3. Early Completion Bonuses;
- Increase Delay Penalties (Liquidated Damages);
- 5. Reserving right to **not** award to lowest bid received based on observed costs/schedule.

Both the baseline and accelerated schedule are included in the tender documents with a requirement to provide traffic staging, schedule and cost submissions for each option. Current low bid indicates the baseline schedule is more cost effective and preferred from a resource capacity perspective

## **Managing Disturbances**

Possible Disturbance	How they May Be Managed
Traffic Disruption	<ul> <li>Staging of construction (July / August will be constrained to between the bridge and Chaffey)</li> <li>Maintaining one lane of traffic each way</li> <li>Alternative routes with advanced warning signage</li> </ul>
Disruption of Pedestrian Traffic	<ul> <li>Maintain sidewalks or walking routes where possible</li> <li>Maintain access to business entrances</li> <li>Minimize timing between sidewalk removal and sidewalk replacement</li> </ul>
<b>Business Disruptions</b>	<ul> <li>Notification to businesses</li> <li>Stakeholder Communication (EngageMuskoka, Community Information Sessions)</li> <li>On-site inspector</li> <li>Staging of construction</li> <li>Maintaining access to businesses</li> <li>Advanced notice and selective timing for water/sewer disruptions</li> </ul>
Noise and Dust	<ul> <li>Drilling or blasting operations or other loud operations restricted to between hours of 7:00 am and 7:00 pm Monday to Friday (as per Town of Huntsville Noise bylaw)</li> <li>Dust control measures as per OPSS.MUNI 506 (the Ontario Provincial Standard Specification for dust suppression)</li> </ul>
Health and Safety	<ul> <li>Use of temporary concrete barriers between live lanes of traffic and construction zone/trench excavation</li> <li>Time limitations for loud noise</li> <li>Dust suppression</li> </ul>



### **Keeping You Informed / Get Involved!**

#### Planned Notifications:

- General Notice construction schedule
- Local notices 1 week before road closure and removal of asphalt
- Advance roadside notification of traffic disruptions / alternative routes
- 24-hour advance notice for water / sewer disruptions prior to connection work
- 72-hour advance notice to affected residents/businesses for sidewalk removal works

Businesses/residents will also be provided with a key point of contact for immediate answers/assistance, during the project.

Completion of Stage 6 (Top lift of Asphalt)	June 15, 2020
